## Entering Exhibits

**All ages \$5 per page or part thereof**

1. Fill out entry form using a pen.
2. Please use only one side of the form.
3. **List entries in the order shown in the Prize List.**
4. Only one entry per exhibitor per class is permitted.
5. An entry form may contain entries from one exhibitor only (i.e. different exhibitors may not share the same form)
6. Bring the entry form(s) to the Agricultural Society office **prior to 4 p.m., July 20, 2018.**  
**Entries close at 4 p.m. sharp.**
7. **Entry fee is \$5 per entry form page, whether page is full or partly full.**
8. The Agricultural Society will produce exhibit tags. **Pick up entry tags** at the Agricultural Society office **on or before August 7<sup>th</sup>.** (If you wish to have them mailed to you they will be sent C.O.D.)
9. Attach tag to each entry. **Bend up bottom portion to cover your name.** Tags must remain attached to exhibits during the show.
10. Exhibits must be fresh and clean.
11. Grain and garden produce, except when specified, must be grown by the exhibitor in the current year. Judges may cut vegetables open.
12. Articles entered in collections may not be entered in single classes and vice versa.
13. Bring entries to the Exhibit Hall on **Wednesday, August 8<sup>th</sup> between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m.**  
**No entries will be accepted after the doors are closed at 1 p.m.**

14. Pick up your exhibits (**CARRY OUT ONLY**) on **Saturday, August 11<sup>th</sup> between 8:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.** **OR VEHICLE PICK UP: Monday, August 13<sup>th</sup> from 11am-1pm.** Any entries left will be disposed of after **August 31, 2018.**
15. **NO VEHICLES WILL BE ADMITTED TO THE GROUNDS FOR THE DURATION OF THE FAIR!!!!**
16. Exhibitors will not be permitted into the Exhibit Hall while judging is in progress, apart from society directors and volunteers.

### Cheesy Biscuits

- 1 ¾ cups all purpose flour
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- 5 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup shredded cheese

Preheat oven to 450 degrees F (230 degrees C). In a large bowl sift together flour, salt and baking powder. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Make a well in the centre of the flour mixture. Add the milk and cheddar cheese; stir to combine. Drop a spoonful onto an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 12-15 minutes until lightly browned.

### Banana Chocolate Chip Muffins

1 medium egg                      1 ½ cups of flour    ¾ cup of milk                      ¾ cup of chocolate chips  
 ½ cup of brown sugar            ½ cup of puréed banana            ¼ cup of vegetable oil            3 tsp of baking powder  
 ½ teaspoon of salt                ½ teaspoon of cinnamon    ¼ teaspoon of nutmeg

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease a muffin tin and set aside.

2. In large bowl combine egg, milk, banana, and oil. Mix to combine.

3. In small bowl sift together flour, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg.

4. Slowly mix dry ingredients into egg mixture until just moistened, but still lumpy. Fold in chocolate chips.

5. Fill muffin tins until 2/3 full. Bake for 20-25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center of one of the muffins comes out clean.

In the HOME BAKING SECTION, the judges will cut loaves of bread and cake.

All breads will be judged on the following points:

1. External appearance.....20%
2. Internal factors.....50%
3. Flavor.....30%

All cakes will be judged on the following points:

1. General appearance and crust.....15%
2. Crumb.....60%
3. Flavor.....20%

No cake mixes permitted unless specified. All baking **MUST** be shown in plastic bags, otherwise it will be disqualified. Try for appropriately sized bags, **USE ZIP LOCK BAGS, NOT TWIST TIES**. **Do not use muffin liners.**

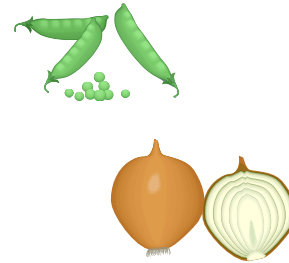

### Suggestions for Junior Gardeners:

1. At the time of planting, use row markers to identify item and variety.
2. Row markers should be waterproof.
3. Keep your seed packages to paste into your journals. Keeping a journal keeps you organized. Mark down the varieties of vegetables and flowers that you used. Mark down dates of planting, fertilizing, and progress along the way. Photos inserted make an interesting pictorial journal. Include comments about your preferences so that you can make choices that you prefer for next year.
4. Don't forget to use fertilizer (i.e. 20-20-20 diluted) or well-rotted manure.
5. Try to be the only one looking after your garden. Be prepared to discuss with the judges the way you put your garden together. Think about planting tall plants at the back and shorter ones at the front to access moisture and sunshine.
6. If you aren't home during judging, make sure your name is displayed close to your garden.
7. Remember to have fun with this. If something doesn't come up when you're expecting it to come, chose something else and get it in but please, no bedding plants...seeds only!

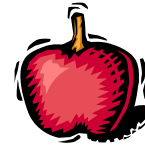
## VEGETABLES AND FRUIT

Judging standards are available - the publication "Judging Standards for Horticultural Shows" can be purchased (see page 3) or on loan from the Vegreville Public Library. Vegetables must be shown on WHITE paper plates. Carrots, beets, and onions must have the tops cut off about 1 cm above the crown and be uniform in size. Rhubarb leaf blades must be trimmed 2.5 cm in a fan shape, and stalk to be left intact as pulled.

Leave stems on Classes 5101 to 5113. Name the variety if possible for viewer appreciation. Display on white paper plates.

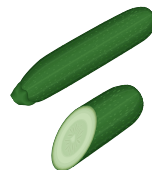
