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What to Bring:

Personal Items:

- Notebook with Pen/pencil
- Camp chair (or some other form of chair. Not all facilities have chairs available)
- Lunch/snacks/water – Please do not bring any alcoholic beverages to the clinic
- Jacket/sweater
- Gloves – leather work gloves, or a tighter-fitting work glove that will protect your hands
- Bug spray (summer only)
- Camera/phone – If you want to take pictures/video of the demonstrations

Horses:

- Plan to bring up to 2 horses over the course of the weekend. If you are a fast trimmer, and finish ahead of the rest of the class, you can follow me as I move from student to student to observe and discuss other horses. If you have a 3rd horse that you want to bring to practice on, feel free to do so, but I will not be able to spend as much (or any) time with you on that 3rd horse, depending on the size of the clinic and the experience of the students averaged across the group. My clinics and the time schedule is based on 2 horses per student over the weekend.
 - o If you have more horses that you would like professional input on, we can book a separate virtual consultation after the clinic. Contact me for details.

Horse Items:

- Horse Fly Spray (summer only) – A horse twitching and stomping because of flies can be very difficult to trim
- Halter/Lead for tying to the tie rail
- If you are planning to leave your horse overnight, please notify me so that arrangements can be made. Not all facilities hosting a clinic offer overnight boarding. .

Tools (please let me know on the sign-up form if you need me to supply tools for you to purchase on-site. I will have a selection of these tools available at the clinic as well.):

“Must-haves” (If you don’t have these, you can purchase them from me):

- Nippers
- Hoof Knife
- Rasp (with handle)
- Hoof Stand
- Hoof Pick

And last but not least, bring a smile, lots of questions, and a willingness to learn. It will be an incredible two days of learning practical skills that will make you a better horse owner!
