Rules and Regulations for Exhibitors

• Everyone is welcome to enter. It is not necessary to be a member of the Vegreville Agricultural Society (VAS) or the Vegreville Garden Club.

Please read the rules & guidelines carefully and consult the rules relating to <u>specific</u> <u>classes</u> in the list!

Entering Exhibits

- 1. Fill out entry form using a pen.
- 2. Please use only one side of the form.
- 3. List entries in the order shown in the Prize List.
- 4. Only one entry per exhibitor per class is permitted.
- 5. An entry form may contain entries from one exhibitor only (i.e. different exhibitors may not share the same form)
- 6. Bring the 2022 entry form(s) to the Vegreville Agricultural Society office or apply online at www.vegag.ca prior to 4 p.m., July 22, 2022.
 - Entries close at 5 p.m. sharp.
- 7. Entry fee is \$0.50 per item entered
- 8. The Agricultural Society will produce exhibit tags. **Pick up entry tags** at the Agricultural Society office on or before July 29th.
- 9. ATTACH TAGS TO ENTRY. TAGS SHOULD BE ATTACHED PRIOR TO DROP-OFF. **Bend up bottom portion to cover your name**. Tags must remain attached to exhibits during the show.
- 10. Exhibits must be fresh and clean.
- 11. Grain and garden produce, except when specified, must be grown by the exhibitor in the current year. Judges may cut vegetables open.
- 12. Articles entered in collections may not be entered in single classes and vice versa.
- 13. Bring entries to the Exhibit Hall on Tuesday August 2nd between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. No entries will be accepted after the doors are closed at 1 p.m.
- 14. Pick up your exhibits <u>Monday Aug. 8, between 10:00 am- 1:00 pm.</u> No items will be transported to the office upon completion of the fair.
- 15. Exhibitors will not be permitted into the Exhibit Hall while judging is in progress, with the exception of society directors and volunteers.

Judging and Awarding Prizes

- 16. All Judges decisions are final. Any exhibitor lodging a protest must make it in writing, and it must be delivered to the Secretary within 48hrs after the close of the Country Fair, accompanied by a deposit of \$75.00, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not sustained.


